She serves as a director of the Thoracic Surgery Research Foundation of Montréal and previously served as a director of the Board of the Cancer Research Society. Monique is also a past board member of the Bank of Canada, Vancouver Symphony Orchestra and of the TELUS Vancouver Community Board and a Trustee of the Legal Leaders for Diversity Trust Fund.

In 2002, Monique was honoured with the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal; in 2015, she was inducted into the Women's Executive Network Hall of Fame after being named to their Top 100 Most Powerful Women in Canada list for three consecutive years; in 2016, she was honoured as Women in Communications and Technology's Woman of the Year; and in

2018, she received the 2018 Lifetime Achievement Award at the annual Canadian General Counsel Awards ceremony.
